Philippians 3

- 1. 3:1 For me to write the same things to you again.
- 2. 3:2-3 For it is we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh.
- 3. 3:4-6 Circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for legalistic righteousness, faultless.
- 4. 3:7 Whatever was to my profit.
- 5. 3:8-9 Not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ--the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith.
- 6. 3:10-11 So somehow to attain to the resurrection from the dead.
- 7. 3:12 To take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.
- 8. 3:13-14 Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.
